Wednesdays, May 25 & June 1

Vintage Printing Basics (David Aubry, Kristina Powers-Aubry)
Create your own one-page newsletter, flyer or poster, using the vintage Washington hand printing press. The first session will involve learning press operation and typesetting, with the second session focusing on final typesetting and document printing. (Class limited to 8; \$70/\$60 for Society Members)

Wednesday, June 15

Quilting (Ruthie Dorrance, Ruthie's Paint & Yarn)
Create your own quilt block and learn how to plan patterns, and hand sewing techniques as they did in the 1900s. Bring one light and one dark fabric swatch and a sharp pair of shears. There will be some fabric and shears available to use. (Class limited to 25)

Wednesday, July 20

Blacksmithing: Coat Hook (Eric Mattson, Arctic Forge)
Make your own coat hook, while learning blacksmith skills
using the Village forge. Participants should wear long pants
and closed-toe shoes as we will be working near a fire in
the blacksmith shop. (Class limited to 4)

Wednesday, August 17

Slip Decorated Sculpture (Cindy Krill, Ceramic Artist)
Make your own sculpture and learn centuries old
techniques still used today, including application of slip
colors. Pottery will require firing and will be available for
pick up at a later date. Wear old clothes or work shirt.
(Class limited to 25)



The Historic Village is going live this spring! We will be opening different buildings each day, Wednesday through Sunday, with docents dressed in period costumes to recreate a living, interactive historic Village. We need your support to make the Historic Village a unique educational and cultural facility to learn about life in times long past. We also have another great Historic Speaker Series this season, and explore our new Historic Skills Workshops where you can learn tasks as they were done 100 years ago from pottery painting and quilting, to blacksmithing and printing press basics.

Historic Speaker's Series

Presentations are no charge and held at the Vicksburg Community Center, 100 S. Main St., 7:00 -8:30 p.m.

Tuesday, May 17

Vicksburg's Quilt Trail (held at Vicksburg District Library)
National author, Suzi Parron, takes us on a humorous journey along the national quilt trail from the first barn quilt painted in Ohio in 2001; features over 100 stunning photographs from around the country including a book signing of "Following the Barn Quilt Trail" with a section devoted to the Vicksburg Quilt Trail.

Tuesday, June 21

Battle of Sunset Lake

The country's history formed during the Revolutionary War will be examined by AJ Hartman, teacher of history in Schoolcraft. His presentation will focus on the pivotal battles of the war and how we almost lost to the British. His talk is a prelude to The Battle of Sunset Lake, sponsored by Society to be held from June 25-26.

Tuesday, July 19

Secret's of the Vicksburg Museum

Every object in the Society's collection has a tale to tell, whether it's an autograph book from the 19th century, Native American artifacts, each is important to preserve and learn about. Come and see for yourself the secrets entrusted to us to preserve.

Tuesday, August 16

WWII Home Front Industries-Vicksburg & Kalamazoo

Well known local historian Steve Rossio tells the story of how the challenges of supplying ourfighting forces changed Michigan into one of the most important states in the war effort becoming "The Arsenal for Democracy", producing tanks and bombers.

Tuesday, October 18

The Old Sauk Trail - U.S. 12

A quaint, quizzical and quirky (yet curiously informative) slide lecture by guide Dr. John S. Geisler, as we visit museums, inns, a vintage meat market, theaters, rocks, land offices, tombs, railroad stations, camelback bridge, and a featherbone factory.

Tuesday, November 15

Medieval Mysteries

Mel Starr, medieval mystery writer, tells the tale, spiced with humor, of his remarkable character, Hugh de Singleton, a 14th century surgeon, bailiff, and social commentator. Using logic, observation and diligent effort he solves capital crimes.
